Walking in the Spirit

vs.13- "called"-(kaleo) invited (same word vs.8)

- Paul uses this word again to keep reminding them that they were invited away from the direction they are going
- -"use not liberty"- liberty must be maintained, not abused

(It becomes abused when its turned into a license to sin)

- -"occasion"-(aphorme) a military term that means a base or headquarters
- *the meaning behind what Paul is saying here is that the freedom that Christians have is not a base or platform from which they can sin freely from
- -"by love" (agape) the deepest of the loves mentioned in the Bible (agape, eros, philia, storge)
 *agape love is given to us by Christ an is the motive of true Christian conduct
- -"serve one another" (douleuo) to yield or submit to
- Christian love is submission to each other and not submission to the Law
- vs.14- Paul's reference here implies the morality of the Law in relation to others (Ex.20:12-17)
 - -"love they neighbor" this love is a product of the Holy Spirit

*What was the real fulfillment of the Law? Love (John 3:16)

<u>Truth</u>- when a Christian genuinely loves others, he/she fulfills all the moral requirements of the Mosaic Law concerning each other

*Paul then quotes <u>Lev.19:18</u> to prove his point

- God's love that fulfilled the Law is the same love that is imputed into all believers
- vs.15- the contrasting image Paul uses here is that of wild animals attacking each other

Question- Why do animals attack each other? Coveting and dominance

- <u>Truth</u>- a legalist will always try to be dominant, imposing, and intimidating (like their teacher)
- this is what eventually happens between believers when we don't <u>love</u> and <u>serve</u> one another <u>vs.16</u>- "Walk" (peripateo) to make due use of opportunity

(This term is for how to regulate your life and how to conduct yourself)

-"Spirit"- it is He that gives us Divine direction and energizing power to overcome

(Our only hope for deliverance from selfish lusts is the Holy Spirit's guidance)

-"lusts of the flesh"- keep in mind that the flesh is not redeemed (only our spirit)
(Flesh dies and returns to the ground)

- *when God saves, He does not eradicate the old nature nor does He reform an old life (He regenerates us by giving us a new nature in our spirit but we're still wrapped in sinful flesh)
- *a continual "walking" in the Spirit is the way a believer can have continual victory over flesh vs.17- "flesh"- (sarx) this term means a physical person (blood, bones, and tissue)
 - but it also means the sensuous nature of a person (this natural nature of man craves sin)
 "lusteth" (epithumeo) to turn on something
- *the flesh opposes the work of the Holy Spirit and leads the believer towards sinful behavior that he/she would not otherwise be compelled to do
- -"contrary"- the Holy Spirit opposes the flesh and gives victory over it
- the flesh opposes the Spirit in attempts to prevent us from obedience, surrender, and victory Truth- this is why Satan likes to tempt us according to the flesh
- vs.18- being led by the Spirit means one is saved and living in obedience to Christ- John 16:13-14
- -"<u>under the Law</u>"- the Law brings condemnation as it reveals in man what condemns him (Being under that means being under condemnation)
- <u>Truth</u>- with the Spirit abiding in redeemed man to keep him in line and "<u>walking</u>" properly, there is no need for an external curb such as the Law (<u>Rom.8:1-2</u>)
